WHEREAS, on August 2, 2011, Councilman Stokes was elected to the Hinds County Board of Supervisors where he will serve the constituents of District 5 with dedication and distinction; and

WHEREAS, it is with great pride that the Jackson City Council pause to salute Councilman Stokes on his unwavering dedication throughout his many years of service.
